# MAINTAINING A SCHOOL'S INFRA-STRUCTURE for SUSTAINABILITY IN A 'GREEN' ENVIRONMENT



## The Swahili saying "usipoziba ufa utajenga ukuta"

If you don't fill in a crack on the wall you will have to build a brand new wall

The Rudolf Steiner School Mbagathi is situated south of Nairobi National Park, in Kenya, it has 400 children; the majority (80%) of the children comes from socially and financially disadvantaged family backgrounds with severe social and economic needs. It is the school's mission to help these needy children to have an education. Many children are orphans, or with absent mothers and fathers. The children face home situations like, alcoholism, neglect, abuse, and others that are difficult to imagine. 120 children are in full boarding; this provides a much needed safe area. The children flourish in this environment, with their dedicated



teachers, regular healthy meals and a caring/loving environment.

The school's running costs are dependent on sponsorship and fundraising; this is because the parent body are unable to pay school fees. Parents can hardly meet their own rent and food costs which are the most basic needs that face them. The task of finding school fees is therefore left to the school with no support from the government. The school in the last few years have been increasingly challenged financially for a combination of reasons. We took in more children over the COVID pandemic period due to the large number of children and families seeking help. Prices of especially food and fuel, rising inflation due to world events - the Ukraine war have affected our school's economy.

On the national level Kenya is facing its own economic challenges. Firstly, we are in a severe drought which is having devastating consequences in the lives of Kenyans. The new Kenyan government is trying to save the Kenyan economy by finding all ways to meet the needs of the country. They look to the people - for example the electricity prices are set to rise by 78% in April 2023; these measures place greater stress on organizations and individuals.

We need to maintain our infra-structure - not only build. We need to care for our surroundings, our buildings, our water system, our solar/electrical system our kitchen - this is our school's infra-structure which must be kept well maintained for us to fulfil our school's aim. All these areas need to be running efficiently, clean, safe and healthy. These are all parts of our green environment which we need to protect. To reach this goal we have to acknowledge the needs of maintenance and we need to meet these costs.

Our Staff Team: the School Leader, the Head of Finances, the Compound Manager and the Head of Maintenance - have carefully identified - a long list of highly needed and severe acute Maintenance tasks, which has been put together into a Project for 2023. It covers the following 5 main areas – in summary:

- 1) Earth's Environment buildings and grounds
- 2) Water clean water plumbing
- 3) Light generator, solar electrics
- 4) Warmth cooking, vegetables/food production
- 5) Labour/Casuals

TIMELINE for the maintenance project runs from April 2023 to December 2023. We have a schedule in three sections of three months each, they can be carried out independently. We will follow up after each section.

Water developments: Secure water system, repair pipes, water tanks, sinks and leaks. ### **Labour/Casuals:**

A lot of work at the school is done by casuals – needy Kenyan workers. Without labour/casuals no work can be completed. The above mentioned areas of work require their human input. Our system is functioning well and efficient with monitoring from the Maintenance Team. Every time we support a casual we support a needy family.
