Greetings from the Rudolf Steiner School. Our school is running well and learning is continuing with enthusiasm from both the children and the teachers.

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Limited Covid restrictions remain in place, the government requires schools to have four terms in the year 2022 to make up for lost time. We expect our yearly rhythm will return at the beginning of 2023. Schools also have had to take a short break while the 2022 elections took place as many schools were being used for polling stations; and elections also bring a degree of nervousness in the country due to previous post-election violence. Schools are open again but there remains an ongoing process while the presidential result declared is being contested.

The condition in the country, especially drought and also the effects of the Ukraine war have forced prices to rise dramatically. This inevitably puts a strain on families and schools, especially in the area of food and fuel. The school never the less is making steps in its development.

The special needs department is grounding. Counselling sessions have taken further steps with our school counsellor visiting weekly. We have a medical officer also making her first steps in our school with assessments and sessions for the children, parents and staff. These particular developments are not possible without partner organizations.

Additional toilets were required in both our girls and boys boarding where we house 120 children. This was a government requirement which is in process.

Our school relies on our good sponsors who faithfully pay their monthly contribution to the school. We value this gift in our hearts and say a big thank you for making this school possible.

In the recent years the farm received funding for a green house, which helps a lot in growing of crops which are affected by harsh weather conditions like tomatoes and French beans. Thanks to the funders we also got a new drip system which has really improved the production in the garden. The farm produces very healthy food free from chemical sprays and chemical fertilizers which is good for the health of the children. The farm is also a learning area where the students learn a lot through their participation in farm activities.
